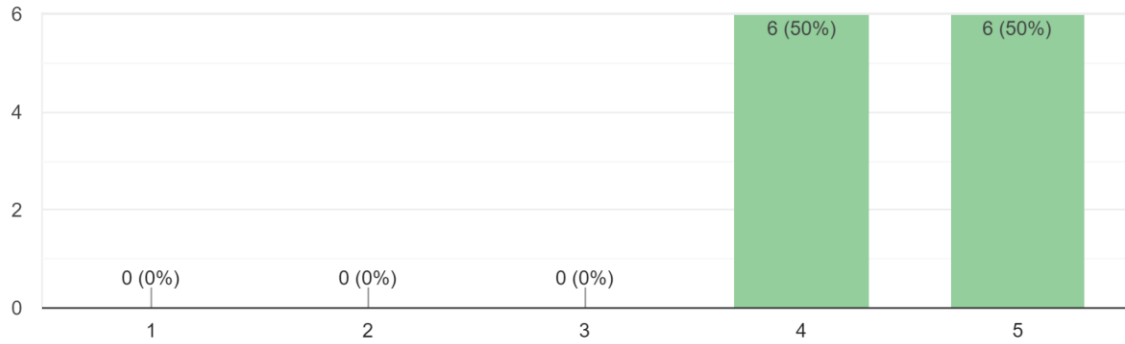

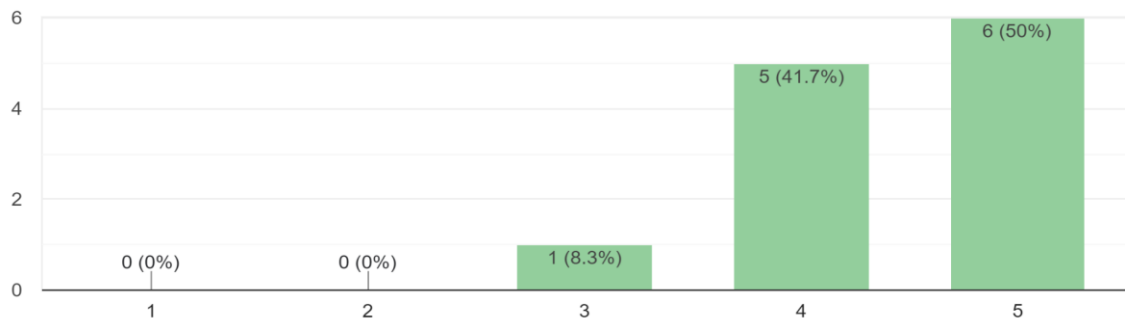
The overall conduction of the program

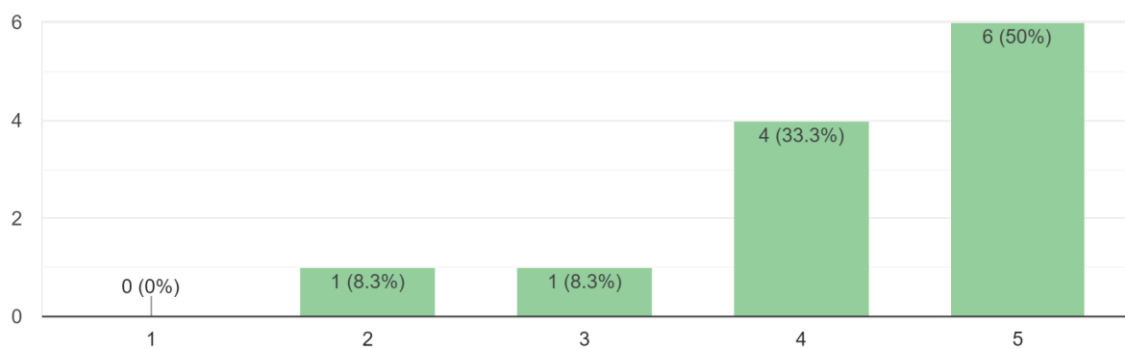
